Votes Included:

HB 157: Requires advance disclosure of an agenda for a public meeting. FAV Motion passed 20-1 (2 excused). Pro vote is pro-consumer. Vote date March 14, 2014.

HB 480: Establishes an office of the Consumer Protection Division of the MD Attorney General’s Office in Prince George’s County. FWA Motion passed 21-1 (1 excused). Pro vote is pro-consumer. Vote date Feb. 21, 2014.

HB 1272: Requiring parents to receive notice of right to put security freeze on child’s credit record just after birth. FAV Motion lost 2-20 (1 excused). Pro vote is pro-consumer. Vote date March 20, 2014.
